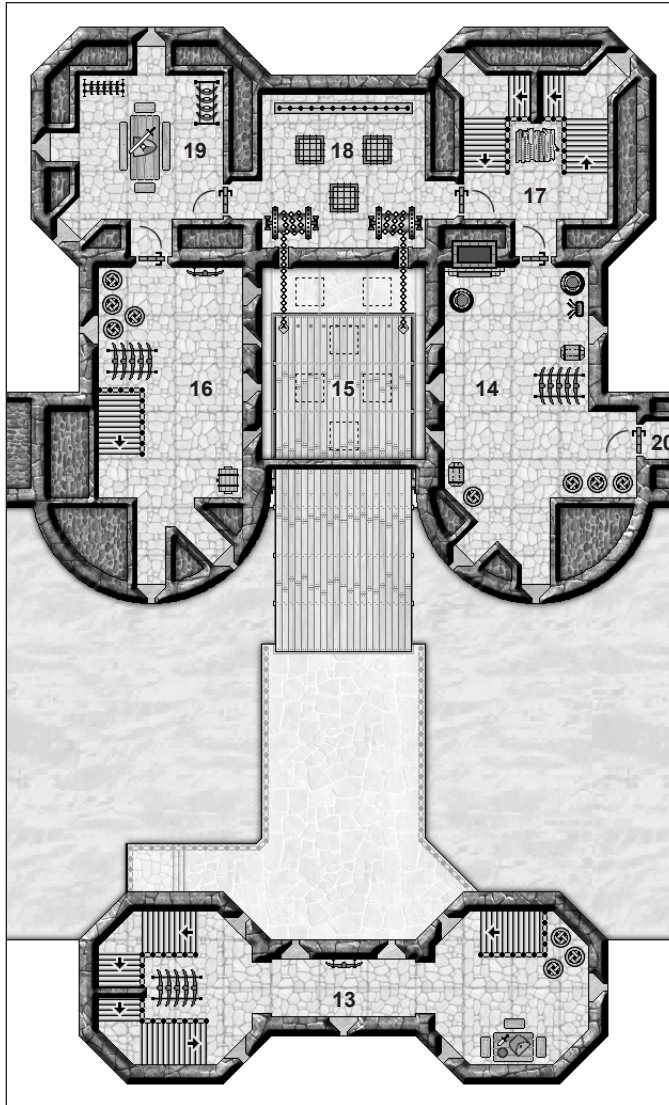
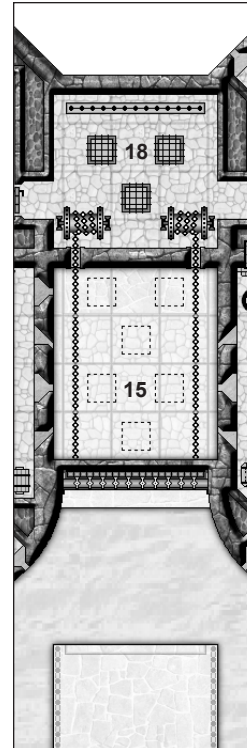


Second Floor (drawbridge lowered)

The King's Gate

This is a four-story grand gatehouse with an outer three-story barbican gatehouse and causeway. The gatehouse connects with a curtain wall, making the King's Gate equally suitable as an entrance into a fortress or a city.

Each floor of the King's Gate is fifteen feet in height. Floors are indicated as G1 (first floor) through G4 (fourth floor), and U1 (cellar). Maps are numbered sequentially from top left to bottom right, beginning with 01 on each floor. Separate maps are included for a raised or lowered drawbridge.

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
